



n.52 the 12 March 2018

Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: The intense precipitations on Sunday brought snow only above 1700 m. 20-30 cm of new snow fell at 1800 m to the western area of the region and on the Canin massif, less snow on the Giulie Alps and Prealps. Scattered rainfalls up to 2000 m. The snow cover below 1800 m has strongly gained weight because of the rain, while above 2000 m the new snow was abundant. Considerable avalanche danger (3) across the whole territory. Possible spontaneous avalanches of wet or moist snow (generally low-cohesive) on all aspects, below 1700-1900 m, along the usual paths on steep slopes, in some cases even medium-sized avalanches. Possible spontaneous avalanches of new snow (both slab and low-cohesive avalanches), even of medium size, above 1900-2000 m on very steep slopes. The triggered release may occur even by the passage of a single skier/hiker on steep slopes.

Forecast for Tuesday 13 March 2018, reliability: 70%

Both triggered and spontaneous avalanche danger, even of medium size, on all aspects.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Cloudy, scattered snowfalls (0 to 10 cm) above 1200 m. Possible downpours. The snow cover is not well consolidated on some steep slopes not yet released. Considerable avalanche danger (3) across the whole mountain territory. Still possible spontaneous avalanches of wet or moist snow (generally low-cohesive) on all aspects, below 1700-1900 m, along the usual paths on steep slopes, in some cases even medium-sized avalanches. Possible spontaneous avalanches of new snow (both slab and low-cohesive avalanches), even of medium size, above 1900-2000 m on very steep slopes. The triggered release of avalanches, even of medium size, may occur even by the passage of a single skier/hiker on steep slopes above 1800 m.




Forecast for Wednesday 14 March 2018, reliability: 60% Still both spontaneous and triggered avalanche danger.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Variable. Possible scattered snowy downpours above 1200 m. Considerable danger level (3) across the whole territory. Still possible spontaneous avalanches above 1800 m, along the usual paths on very steep slopes on all aspects, especially during the warmest hours of the day and especially on southern aspects, which are the most exposed to the sun. In the accumulation zones above 1800 m the triggered release of avalanches, even of medium size, may occur even by the passage of a single skier/hiker, especially on very steep slopes.

Forecast for Thursday 15 March 2018, reliability: 60%

New abundant snowfalls from the evening. Still both spontaneous and triggered avalanche danger.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Variable in the morning. Cloudy from the afternoon and more abundant precipitations in the evening, snow above about 1000 m. 30 cm of new snow may fall in the late night. Moderate danger level (2) increasing to 3 (considerable) from the late evening, due to new snowfalls. The spontaneous avalanche activity will be restricted to some releases on the steepest slopes on all aspects. It will increase in the late evening with some small-sized avalanches. The triggered release in the accumulation zones above 1900 m may occur with a generally high overload. Not to be excluded the release with low overload (locally triggered by a single skier/hiker) at the highest altitudes on the northern aspects, on very steep slopes.
