


# Situation of 05 April 2019 edition of the hours 14-next update 08-04-2019 hours 14, forecaster: DM

reliability: 80%



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Between Thursday and Friday morning, about 60-80 cm of mainly wet snow fell on the Western region area at about 1800 m, smaller quantities on the Eastern ones and on Pre-Alps, where it mainly rained. The avalanche danger is confined to high altitudes because above 2000 m more than 100 cm of snow has fallen. Above 1700 m will therefore be possible medium and large avalanches from the usual avalanche places at all exposures, even ground avalanches from the steepest grassy slopes. Always above this altitude, to cause triggering of soft slab avalanches is possible even with low additional load, particularly on areas of greatest deposit at all exposures. Current danger level: 4 (high) on the Western Alps and Carnic Pre-Alps, 3 (considerable) on the Alps, Julian Pre-Alps and Eastern Carnic Pre-Alps.

### Forecast for Saturday 06 April 2019, reliability: 70% Avalanches danger both natural and caused above 1700 m.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: On Saturday the sky will be variable, with more clearings on the mountains. The avalanche danger will still be 4 (high) on the Western Alps and Carnic Pre-Alps and 3 (considerable) on the rest of the mountain territory. Above 1700 m, natural avalanches of medium and large dimensions will still be possible from the slopes not released yet in all aspects. From the steepest grassy slopes there will also be possible ground avalanches. The solar radiation, where present, will favor an intensive natural avalanche activity, in particular on the Southern exposures and during the hottest hours. The human triggering of both loose and slab avalanches, of medium and large dimensions, will be possible even with low additional load in all aspects, from steep slopes and mostly from snowdrift deposits.



Forecast for Sunday 07 April 2019, reliability: 70%


#### Possibility of both natural and human triggered avalanches due to not bonded snow yet at altitude.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: On Sunday the sky will be from variable to cloudy. The snowpack will slowly bond. Above 1800 m triggering and medium-sized avalanches will still be possible from the usual avalanche routes not released yet. The human triggered avalanches both slab and loose snow can occur even with low additional load in the areas with the greatest snowdrift deposits and during the hottest hours. Expected danger level: 3 (considerabe) on the Carnicand Julian Alps, and western Carnic Pre-Alps, 2 (moderate) on the Julian and Eastern Carnic Pre-Alps.

## Forecast for Monday 08 April 2019, reliability: 70%

Human triggered avalanches are possible on deposit areas even with low additional load above 1800 m.



**Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger:** On Monday new slight to moderate rainfalls are expected, snowy only above about 1700 m, without significant consequences on avalanche danger. The snowpack will be moderately bonded, the natural avalanche activity will be limited to releases and small avalanches. Above 1800 m below the steepest ridges and passes, human triggering will be possible even with low additional load, mostly on snowdrift areas . Expected danger level: 2 (moderate) throughout the mountain territory.
