




Situation of 03 May 2019 edition of the hours 14-next update 06-05-2019 hours 14, forecaster: MA



New snowfalls above 1800 m with increase in avalanches danger above such altitude.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: New rainfalls are affecting our mountains, snowy above about 1800 m. Below this level the snowpack is wet and weakened even inside due to rain. Above such altitude, natural avalanches of small and medium size are possible, from the steepest slopes and along the usual avalanche routes. Always above such altitude, the human triggering of small and locally medium size avalanches is possible even at a single skier or hiker passage. Expected danger level: 2 (moderate) everywhere.

Forecast for Saturday 04 May 2019, reliability: 70% Possible medium size avalanches both natural and human triggered.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Further snowfalls are expected from the altitude of about 1600 - 1800 m with possible additional 10-30 cm of new snow throughout the mountain territory. The SW winds can favor the formation of new deposits at all aspects. Above 1800 m the natural triggering generally of small and medium size is possible from the usual avalanches routes at all aspects. Always above such altitude and at all aspects the human triggering will be possible even with low additional load. Expected danger level 2 (moderate) increasing to 3 (considerable) on the Alps, on the Pre-Alps 2 (moderate).

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


Forecast for Sunday 05 May 2019, reliability: 60%

Possible avalanches both natural and human triggered of large size as well.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Decrease in temperatures and further snowfalls are expected, which might fall down to an altitude of about 600 - 800 m with an additional 10-30 cm of new snow, throughout the mountain territory. Strong winds during the snowfall will form new deposits on all sides. Above the forest limit, on steep slopes natural avalanches of medium and in some cases even large ones along the usual routes are possible, both loose snow and slabs. The human avalanches triggering, generally of medium size, will be possible even with low additional load on all steep slopes above an altitude of 1800 m. Expected danger level 3 (considerable) throughout the territory.

Forecast for Monday 06 May 2019, reliability: 60% Possible avalanches both natural and human triggered of large size as well.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Thermal zero at about 1500 m. Expected strong winds that might form new deposits on all sides. Above the forest limit, on the steep slopes, natural avalanches of medium and in some cases even large ones will be possible along the usual routes, both loose snow and slabs. The human avalanches triggering, generally of medium size, will be possible even with low additional load on all steep slopes above 1800 m. Expected danger level 3 (considerable) throughout the territory.
