








Generally variable skies. Chance of snow flurries in the Alps during the afternoon.

Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Yesterday, 5 to 15 cm of new snow fell in the west, greater quantities in the east, especially in the Canin area. The wind formed new snowdrifts in hollows, gullies, andunder ridges. In the Canin area, avalanche danger is 3 (considerable): beyond the treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, and at all exposures, triggered slab avalanches, even of mediumsize, can occur even with the passage of single skiers-hikers. From mountain sides and onvery steep slopes, small- and medium-sized superficial natural avalanches are possible, both with loose cohesion and slabs. Throughout the rest of the territory, avalanche dangeris 2 (moderate): on steep slopes located beyond the treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, chance of small triggered slabs, even with a low overload, mostly creating smallavalanches. Small natural avalanches from mountain sides and along the steepest slopesare also possible.

Clear or partly cloudy skies.

Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Good weather, cold and sustained wind from the north. New snowdrifts will form at allexposures, with little involvement of the old compact and frozen snowpack. In the Caninarea, avalanche danger will be 3 (considerable): beyond the treeline, in areas withsnowdrifts, and at all exposures, triggered slab avalanches, even of medium size, canoccur even with the passage of single skiers-hikers. From mountain sides and on verysteep slopes, small- and medium-sized superficial natural avalanches are possible, bothwith loose cohesion and slabs. Throughout the rest of the territory, avalanche danger is 2(moderate): on steep slopes located beyond the treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, chanceof small triggered slabs, even with a low overload, mostly creating small avalanches. Smallnatural avalanches from mountain sides and along the steepest slopes are also possible. Beware of icy patches.


















Avalanche danger 3 (considerable) in the Canin area, 2 (moderate) in remaining areas.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Good weather expected with continued low temperatures. Snowdrifts present at highaltitudes, which are usually easily recognizable by experts, must be avoided, since theycan easily detach. In the Canin area, avalanche danger will be 3 (considerable): beyondthe treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, and at all exposures, triggered slab avalanches, evenof medium size, can occur even with the passage of single skiers-hikers. Naturalavalanche activity is decreasing, mainly characterized by sluffs on very steep slopes. Throughout the rest of the territory, avalanche danger will be 2 (moderate): on steepslopes beyond the treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, chance of small triggered slabs, evenwith a low overload, creating mostly small avalanches. Small natural avalanches arepossible. Beware of icy patches.

Forecast for Thursday 18 March 2021, reliability: 70%

Snowdrifts present at high altitudes, whichare usually easily recognizable by experts, must be avoided, since they can easily detach. In the Canin area, avalanche danger will be 3 (considerable): beyond the treeline, in areaswith snowdrifts, and at all exposures, triggered slab avalanches, even of medium size, canoccur even with the passage of single skiers-hikers. Possible releases on very steepslopes in sunny areas. Throughout the rest of the territory, avalanche danger will be 2(moderate): on steep slopes beyond the treeline, in areas with snowdrifts, chance of smalltriggered slabs, even with a low overload, creating mostly small avalanches.
