

Avalanche danger 2 (moderate), due to the presence of locally unstable wind-blown accumulations.






Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Variable skies with wind at high altitudes, which can cause further snow accumulations, especiallyalong gullies, passes, and ridges. Low temperatures still favor the formation of weak layers withinthe snowpack. Avalanche danger is 2 (moderate) above approximately 1800 m and 1 (low) belowthis altitude, throughout the entire mountain territory. Wind-blown accumulations above 1800 m,especially locally at northern aspects on very steep slopes, can be triggered by high overload, givingrise to small-l and medium-sized avalanches. Low overload is not excluded locally, especially in thenorth on extreme slopes. Beware of areas with old layers of hard or frozen snow.

Forecast for Tuesday 11 January 2022, reliability: 70%

Avalanche danger 2 (moderate), due to the presence of locally unstable wind-blown accumulations.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Clear skies and continued strong winds at high altitudes from North-East. This situation may causefurther snow accumulations, especially along gullies, passes, and ridges. Avalanche danger will be2 (moderate) above approximately 1800 m and 1 (low) below this altitude, throughout the entiremountain territory. Wind-blown accumulations above 1800 m, especially locally at northernexposures on very steep slopes, may be triggered by high overload, giving rise to small- andmedium-sized avalanches. Low overload is not be excluded locally, especially in the north onextreme slopes. Beware of areas with layers of hard or frozen snow



Forecast for Wednesday 12 January 2022, reliability: 70%


Avalanche danger 2 (moderate), due to the presence of locally unstable wind-blown accumulations.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Continued clear skies and freezing temperatures at approximately 800 m and continued strong windfrom NE at high altitudes. Avalanche danger will be 2 (moderate) above approximately 1800 m and 1 (low) below this altitude, throughout the entire mountain territory. The main avalanche danger will consist of wind-blown snow accumulations, oftentimes thick in higher gullies, but also in thebasins and in slope changes. If overloaded, these may detach locally, even with the additional loadof a single hiker or skier, especially on the highest slopes and in at northern exposures. The expected avalanches will be mainly medium-sized. Beware areas with layers of hard or frozensnow.

Forecast for Thursday 13 January 2022, reliability: 60%

Avalanche danger 2 (moderate,) due to the presence of locally unstable wind-blown accumulations.



Snow cover conditions and avalanche danger: Clear skies, dry air, and increasing freezing temperatures from evening. This situation will notchange the level of danger, which will be 2 (moderate) above approximately 1800 m and 1 (low)below this altitude, throughout the mountain territory. The main avalanche danger will continue toconsist of wind-blown snow accumulations in gullies, basins, and slope changes. If overloaded, these may detach locally, even with the additional load of a single hiker or skier, especially on thehighest slopes and at northern exposures. The expected avalanches will be mainly medium-sized. Beware of areas with layers of hard or frozen snow.
